Written in Stone

God took the time to write the Ten Commandments in granite with his own finger. As Christians, is this something that we should think about today? In Roman 6:14, we can read that we are no longer under the law but under grace. Does that mean that Christians no longer have an obligation to keep the Ten Commandments? In the story of Daniel and the lion's den in chapter six it may help us to understand the Biblical relationship between salvation and the Law of God and how it all fits together.

After the Babylonian kingdom fell to the Persians, the new king, Darius, was very impressed with Daniel's ability and his high spirit, and he was thinking about making him the Prime Minister of his new kingdom. But this was not going over very well with the members of Darius' cabinet. Because Daniel was a former servant of Nebuchadnezzar, who was their enemy, and because Daniel was a former captive among the Israelites, they could not understand why the king wanted to promote somebody that was a foreigner to be the new Prime Minister.

So they came up with a plot and went to Darius and said, "Your Highness, a new kingdom is now being formed now that we have conquered several other empires, and the best way to get everyone all together will be through common worship. So in order for you to get this new kingdom all together, you will need to make a new law. It doesn't have to last long, but just for thirty days nobody will worship any god or man except for you and this will solidify your kingdom." Often the devil uses common worship and common language to do that.

Tax Collector Accepting Shoes for Students

The Pasco County Tax Collector's Office is participating in the new shoes and socks collection campaign to assist local students and families in need. A collaborative effort between Pasco County government and the school district, the "Two Good Soles" campaign, is seeking to collect as many new pairs of shoes and socks as possible. The tax collector's five offices in Pasco County will be collection sites for these donations between now and October 25, the final day of the collection.

The need for shoes is primarily at the middle and high school level. While the tax collector's office will accept donations of shoes and socks that are new and unused, the school district reports that the sizes most in need are children's shoes 9 and up and adults 5 and up. Socks of all sizes are welcome. It is recommended that sneakers, tennis shoes and socks be of a "neutral" color, but all donations of new items will be accepted.

Pasco Tax Collector's Office Offers Fingerprinting Services

Starting on September 12, the Wesley Chapel branch of the Pasco County Tax Collector's Office will begin offering fingerprinting services to the general public. The new service will help individuals who may need fingerprints for professional certification, employment requirements, background checks for volunteer work, records of personal identification or any other reason to have their fingerprints taken quickly and efficiently.

Fingerprinting services will be provided in the Wesley Chapel branch office, which is located in Compark 75 (off Wesley Chapel Boulevard) at 4610 Pet Lane, Suite C101, Lutz 33559. The services will be available on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:30am to 4:00pm and on Tuesdays and

Thursdays from 7:30am to 5:00pm. This service is not available on Saturdays at this time. Appointments for fingerprinting services are not required. Customers will be served on a first-come first-served basis.

The cost for fingerprinting is very reasonable when compared to for-profit providers. If an individual would like their prints taken and transmitted to a third-party (i.e. for employment background checks or other professional requirements) the cost will be \$12 per set of prints. If an individual would like their prints transmitted and would like to retain a hard copy of their prints the cost will be \$17 per set.

Red Cross Tips for Recovering from a Flood

Flood Recovery Tips

- Return home only when officials have declared the area safe.
- Before entering your home, look outside for loose power lines, damaged gas lines, foundation cracks, or other damage.
- Parts of your home may be collapsed or been damaged. Approach entrances carefully. See if porch roofs and overhangs have all their supports.
- Watch out for wild animals, especially poisonous snakes that may have come into your home with the floodwater.
- If you smell natural or propane gas or hear a hissing noise, leave immediately and call the fire department.
- If power lines are down outside your home, do not step in puddles or standing water.
- Keep children and pets away from hazardous sites and floodwater.
- Materials such as cleaning products, paint, batteries, contaminated fuel, and damaged fuel containers are hazardous. Check with local authorities for assistance with disposal to avoid risk.
- During cleanup, wear protective clothing, including rubber gloves and rubber boots.
- Make sure your food and water are safe. Discard items that have come in contact with floodwater, including canned goods, water bottles, plastic utensils, and baby bottle nipples. When in doubt, throw it out!
- Contact your local or state public health department to see if your water supply might be contaminated. You may need to boil or treat it before use. Do not use water that could be contaminated to wash dishes, brush teeth, prepare food, wash hands, make ice, or make baby formula!


Tampa Bay Network to End Hunger Annual Conference
